




The ABA (Anti-Bullying Alliance) defines bullying as:

The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.


Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological.

It can happen face-to-face or online.

### Types of bullying








name calling, calling people unkind names, verbal threats of violence

hitting, kicking, biting, pushing, tripping you up – anything that hurts you by touching you


isolating someone, leaving them out, spreading rumours, threatening looks

social networking pictures, Whatsaap groups to encourage bullying, nasty text messages, filming people without permission, prank calls

### Bullying as a group behaviour





**The ringleader** – Starting and leading the bullying but not always the person 'doing' the bullying.

'Outsider'

The target - The person who is being bullied.

Assistant(s) - Actively involved in 'doing' the bullying.


**Reinforcer(s)** - Supports the bullying, might laugh


or encourage other people to carry

on what is going on.

**Defender(s)** - Stands up for someone being bullied. Knows that bullying is wrong and feels confident enough to do something about it. This might involve talking to an adult in school.

Outsider(s) - Ignores any bullying and doesn't want to get involved.



If people are united, they all agree about something: "On that issue, we're united."




