- Say one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4,5.
- Know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total ('cardinal principle').

Children in Reception will be learning to:

• Count objects, actions and sounds.

Using objects, ask your child to give you different amounts. Who has more? Who has less? What happens if more objects are added or taken away?

Practise counting the objects saying one number name for each object. How many do you have altogether? Say how many there are after counting – for example, "...6, 7, 8. There are 8 balls" – to help children appreciate that the last number of the count indicates the total number of the group.

Challenge:

Say how many there might be before you count. For example "I think there are about 8. Shall we count to see?"



- 5. What does the third pig make his house out of?
- 6. Which houses does the wolf blow over?
- 7. Which house can the wolf not blow over? Why?
- 8. What happens to the wolf at the end of the story?
- 9. How do you think the pigs feel?
- 10. How do you think the wolf feels?


In Phonics, we have covered the sounds shown in the previous slides.
