Physical Education

Intent

At Farnham it is our intent for all of our pupils to confidently and enthusiastically engage in fun, high-quality Physical Education lessons that set the foundations for a healthy, active lifestyle. Implementation

This wide range of sporting activities allows children to develop their own strengths as well as learn new skills and acknowledge the strengths of their peers. We work together with our coaching staff to ensure that all children receive high-quality lessons bursting with participation. As well as teaching them the correct movements, skills and rules of the games, we also ensure that children are using the correct vocabulary and terminology in their lessons. Children are given the chance to apply the skills they learn in competitive situations with the other schools from our Academy.
