




In maths, we have covered quarters, halves and are about to learn about finding a third.







In science, we investigated which items are light sources. Can you spot any around school?











In writing, we have begun to explore a character's thoughts and feelings. We have looked at how they have changed throughout the story.

In history, we looked at the importance of the River Nile. We discovered it was used for washing clothes, drinking water and travel/trade.











