



In **literacy**, we began a new story called *Arghh*, *Spider!* We explored our feelings and talked about emotions, especially around things we might find a little scary. By the end of the week, we realised that **spiders aren't so scary after all** – in fact, they can be quite fascinating!





We have been having lots of fun playing phonics games in our English lessons this week. We are also continuing to practise our handwriting and making sure we use capital letters and full stops in the correct places.

In maths we have been finding quarters of shapes and quantities. We are also singing lots of songs to help us count in 2s, 5s and 10s.

We have enjoyed learning more about carnivores, omnivores and herbivores and designed a pie for an alien creature to eat.

Four badger's legs, the fin of a whale. The scales of three fish and the shell of a snail.


Seven rose petals, a tiny black seed. Five evergreen leaves and the roots of a weed.

In history, we explored why the Romans invaded Britain and how Britain responded and felt about this. We also learnt Latin commands that would have been used by the Roman army!
