




This week we finished reading the story 'Dear zoo'


We have put the animals in order as they appear

Reception









After reading the story, we followed a step-by-step guide to draw our own pictures of Rosie the hen, and everyone did a brilliant job.

In maths, we have been learning about sharing. We helped our teddy bears have a picnic and shared sweets between them, making sure everyone got the same amount. We talked about what is fair and what is not fair, and we're getting really good at spotting the difference!

In computing, we found out what a video call is and how people use it to talk to others who aren't in the same place. We even made a video call to the other Reception class and asked them what their favourite colour was – it was very exciting to see our friends on the screen!



In maths, we have been working really hard to read the time on an analogue clock. We have found this tricky but we have persevered.












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In maths, Year 4 children explored polygons and quadrilaterals, focusing on identifying lines of symmetry. They practiced drawing symmetrical shapes and discussing their properties.

In English, they used the theme "Proud to be from Bradford" to research festivals and began writing non-chronological reports. The children worked hard to include interesting facts and organize their information clearly.

In art, the children experimented with paint to create tints and shades of different colors. They carefully mixed colors to achieve lighter and darker tones and applied them to their artwork.

They showed great creativity and enthusiasm across all subjects this week.
























In English, we have been working hard to edit and improve our writing. We have been focusing on our handwriting and trying extra hard with words containing the letter 's'.
