







This week, we have been learning to recognise our numbers 1–3. We went on a number hunt around school and found lots of numbers in different places!

On Monday we came back to our classrooms to find a discondard taken place. Cindergorilla from our story had left a discoball and music for us to dance to.






In maths we have learnt to add numbers within 10. We enjoyed a carousel of addition activities which helped us practise our addition skills in different ways.




In DT this week we have design our own pull along toys ready for next week where we are going to make them.















We have had great fun in art learning how to use clay we used the pinching technique to make some clay pots.












In writing, we have worked hard to identify the verb and subject of sentences. We then began to think about how we can use pronouns to avoid repetition.








In reading, we have reached an exciting part of our main character's quest to find out if his neighbours really are aliens!
