




At the painting easel we have been painting circles of different sizes.









Reception

We've also started learning about the differences between the countryside and the city. The children have been thinking about what we might see in each place and how they are similar and different.









This week, Year 1 have enjoyed exploring the nature garden. We have also been using pictograms to represent how many daylight hours there are in each season.

In English, we created our own villain and applied our phonic knowledge to describe their appearance and personality.




















Year 2 have enjoyed writing up setting descriptions for 'The land at the top of the beanstalk. They have done really well using adjectives to describe what it would be like up there.

In maths, children have been learning how to add and subtract ones and looked at using tens frames to find number bonds to 10.


In art we have been drawing Victorian school buildings which also links to our learning in History of 'what schools were like in the past'.











In science, we have explored the bones in our body. We used our prior learning on measuring to measure each bone. Then, we ordered them from shortest to longest. Did you know the longest bone is your thigh bone and the shortest bone is in your ear?

In writing, we have recapping our knowledge of verbs and learning about the verb 'to be'. We have identified these in sentences.








This week in science we have been learning about different herbivores, carnivores and omnivores and how they can be identified by their teeth.


In history, we have been learning about the Egyptian beliefs in Gods and Goddesses and how historians used hieroglyphics to learn about then.















In writing, we have been looking at the language and organisational features of a non-chronological report.

In science, we have been learning about the different phases of the moon and how it orbits the Earth at the same rate. We even discussed the differences between the Lunar and Solar calendars.
