


In nursery this week we have been reading the story "Naughty Bus".


In the story he gets up to lots of naughty things like not stopping for his passengers and driving across someone's dinner,

In geography, we have been learning about aerial photographs and labelling a photograph of our local area around school.











In English we have been reading our new story called 'Binny's Diwali'. We have tasted some yummy sweets 'Jalebi' and learned what verbs are.



In science we have started our learning on Microhabitats and explored which minibeasts we could find in leaf litter. We found beetles, worms and spiders!










In maths, we have begun to look at subtraction involving exchanges. We have found it tricky but we have persevered.

In science we have started our new topic about rocks and soils. We are excited to link this to our new geography topic about volcanoes.












In reading, we have started our new book called 'The Wonder Brothers' which is all about magicians and the Blackpool Tower. We are very interested to see what happens next!





In writing, we have started to look at free verse poetry. We identified personification, similes and metaphors in a poem about the planet Earth.
